

REQUIREMENTS AND CORE CLINICAL AND DIDACTIC EDUCATION FOR PGY -II:

Objectives:

By the end of the PGY-II year the resident is able to:

- 1) Discriminate psychiatrically ill patients requiring inpatient treatment from those requiring outpatient treatment;
- 2) Diagnose all Axis I illnesses with assurance, except those beginning in childhood and infancy;
- 3) Formulate and execute correct treatment plans for all Axis I and II diagnoses presenting with psychotic symptoms;
- 4) Correctly use antipsychotic, antidepressant, mood stabilizing agents, and anti-parkinsonian medication in an inpatient setting;
- 5) Correctly apply pharmacotherapy for agitation;
- 6) Correctly and appropriately utilize laboratory monitoring of pharmacotherapy;
- 7) Perform supportive psychotherapy;
- 8) Perform supportive group psychotherapy;
- 9) Provide transitional care for recently discharged psychiatric patient;
- 10) Correctly diagnose and use treatment modalities for substance abuse;
- 11) Thorough appreciation of the use, reliability and validity of the generally accepted techniques for diagnostic psychological assessment;
- 12) Appropriately diagnose and treat major psychiatric disorders in the geriatric population;
- 13) Familiarity with the legal aspects of psychiatric practice;
- 14) Appreciate common cultural differences and its effects on psychiatric practice;
- 15) Successfully complete an oral exam;
- 16) Familiarity with team leadership, especially regarding case management;
- 17) Familiarity with the treatment of children and adolescents in an inpatient setting.

REQUIRED ROTATIONS:

By the completion of PGY-II, Track 1 residents will complete:

- Inpatient Psychiatry, Adult, UH Shreveport or Conway (10 months)
- Substance Abuse (2 months)
- Child/Adolescent Inpatient (1 month)
- Geriatric Psychiatry (1 month)
- Emergency Psychiatry (3 months)
- Consultation-Liaison (2 months)
- Outpatient follow-up (half day/week for 12 months)
- Individual Supervision (2 hours/week for 12 months)
- Emergency Psychiatry Nights

Track 2 or 3:

- Inpatient Psychiatry, UH Shreveport or Conway (10 months)
- Emergency Psychiatry (2-3 months)
- Outpatient follow-up (half day/week for 6 months)
- Individual supervision (2 hours/week for 12 months)
- Emergency Psychiatry Nights

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS FOR COMPLETION OF PGY -2:

1. Care for the following mix from admission to discharge:
 - At least 10 schizophrenic patients
 - At least 10 patients with substance abuse
 - At least 10 dual diagnosis substance abuse and major psychiatric disorder
 - At least 10 patients with major depression
 - At least 5 bipolar disorder - manic phase
 - At least 5 bipolar disorder - depressive phase
 - At least 3 with dementia, delirium or other cognitive disorder
 - At least 4 intellectually disabled dual diagnosis
 - At least 8 with personality diagnosis requiring inpatient treatment
 - At least 1 with dysthymic disorder requiring admission
 - At least 2 with adjustment disorder
 - At least 3 patient status post overdose
 - At least 3 patients in the acute stages of withdrawal on admission
 - At least 2 patients as they progress through substance abuse program
 - At least 5 geriatric patients
 - At least 4 adolescents in an inpatient setting
 - At least 2 children (under 13) in an inpatient setting
2. The resident must attend court on at least 3 commitment cases and obtain experiences testifying, if at all possible.
3. The resident must evaluate at least 100 acute emergency psychiatric cases with supervision.
4. The resident must understand the indications and uses of Electroconvulsive therapy and if available should observe 2 ECT and be able to administer ECT under faculty supervision.

5. Must have at least 2 hours individual supervision weekly throughout the year.
6. Must complete a scholarly project with faculty supervision.
7. **If** residents entered as a PGY II or above, must either videotape an interview with one patient and present it to supervisor for critique, or may interview a patient before the supervisor and present for a critique.
8. Must complete one formal write-up on a patient for inclusion in resident record including all elements of history, MSE, PE, formulation, differential diagnosis and treatment plan.
9. Must complete one case formulation for review.
